

BADGES OF RANK.

NON COMMISSIONED OFFICERS.(NCO's)

Most Non Commissioned officer's wear their rank on the upper right arm whilst Warrant Officer Class 2 and 1 wear it on the lower right arm. In Number eight kit(Soldier 95) WO2's will have a large crown and is not to be mixed up with a Major. Up to Staff Sergeant you address them by their rank and Warrant Officers are address as "SIR"

COMMISSIONED OFFICERS.

Commissioned officers wear their rank on epaulettes which are on both shoulders. In Number 8 kit(Soldier 95) they are easily distinguishable from NCO's even though they are worn in the same place. You should salute all commissioned officers and by doing so pay respect to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the second. You should address all Officers as "SIR"
