What is a Route Card?

- An aid to assist in navigation when moving across country
- Even the best navigator cannot remember everything
- When planning a patrol or expedition a route card must be done



What is a Route Card?

- A copy of the route card must be given to third party in case of running into difficulty
- Incorporates all you have been previously taught



Route Cards

- Routes must be divided into "Legs"
- A "Leg" is distance between two landmarks
- A route card consists of all previous lessons in one
- (e.g. Grid Ref, Conventional signs and Bearings)
